Schedule

During the MUN conference, delegates will follow a structured schedule. Each day will begin with an opening session, followed by committee sessions where delegates will engage in discussions, draft resolutions, and negotiate with their peers. Periodic breaks will allow for networking and relaxation. The conference will culminate in a closing ceremony, where the efforts and achievements of all participants will be celebrated.



Working papers and resolutions:

Resolutions and position papers are essential tools for delegates to express their country's stance on various global issues. A position paper outlines a delegate's research, presenting their nation's perspective and proposed solutions to the committee's agenda topics. Delegates work together to draft, amend, and finalize resolutions, aiming to build consensus and create actionable outcomes that reflect the collective will of the international community.



DAY 1

The first day of MUN is primarily focused on greetings, team building, and initial discussions. Delegates introduce themselves and establish connections with others, fostering a cooperative environment.

The day is designed to break the ice, allowing delegates to feel comfortable while laying the groundwork for future collaboration and debate.



DAY 2

On the second day, the conference shifts toward research and paperwork. Delegates spend their time delving deeper into their country's stance on the issues, gathering more information, and preparing their speeches.

Much of the day is spent drafting resolutions and negotiating with other delegates to ensure that their ideas are reflected.



DAY 3

The third and final day of MUN is all about action, with voting procedures taking center stage. Delegates present and debate the resolutions that have been drafted over the previous days, making amendments where necessary.

The day is filled with intense discussions as delegates work to find common ground. As the conference concludes, a closing ceremony unites everyone to celebrate the hard work and collaboration that took place, recognizing the accomplishments of the event.
