## Tuvan throat singing

Greetings, I'm Anna, and today on my blog, I want to talk about something that really fascinates me. Like many, I enjoy playing music in the background while I cook. Usually, I just pick a playlist on a music app, but sometimes I discover new music accidentally like when I click on one of the suggestions YouTube gives me. Thanks to internet 1)\_\_\_\_\_\_, I've found many hidden gems. One recent discovery of mine is Tuvan throat singing.

Tuvan throat singing comes from Tuva, a mysterious republic located on the 2)\_\_\_\_\_\_ between Mongolia and Russia. In Tuvan throat singing, the performer creates a base pitch and produces one or more additional sounds. This singing tradition has a long history and was traditionally practised mainly by men, but now women are starting to learn it too. The popularity of throat singing among Tuvan people is closely tied to their geography. As it is a small landlocked nation, the people there try to preserve their authentic traditions distinctive to their environment and culture.

There are several styles and sub-styles of throat singing but the most well-known style of Tuvan throat singing is Khoomei, which has a softer sound. When singers perform in this style, it sounds like the wind swirling among rocks. It seems like something magical is happening in front of your eyes but

the hidden 3)\_\_\_\_\_ is more straightforward than one might think, the singers use their throats to give out a continuous deep sound, and, at the same time, use tongues to control the breathed out air, they manage to modulate the resonance in more high-pitched harmonics.

As throat singing is widespread in the region, there are many famous talented musicians but one of my all-time favourite music groups from Tuva is Huun-Huur-Tu. They are considered the leading representatives of Tuva's music. The most unique aspect of Huun-Huur-Tu's music is their throat singing, where they can produce two or three notes simultaneously, giving the impression of a flute, whistle, or bird, all with just their voices.

Huun-Huur-Tu was formed in 1992, and their name means "sunbeams" in the Tuvan language. All the band members come from Tuva's 4)\_\_\_\_\_ culture, so their songs are inspired by ancient shamanic rituals. They play traditional instruments such as the flute, fiddle, lute, and percussion.

I'm excited to have discovered this incredible traditional singing style through which I came to love this amazing band that represents their culture so well.

Discovering music from other cultures can be an inspiring and rewarding experience. It doesn't matter if it is from Sweden, the Gambia, Fiji Island or somewhere else on our planet and maybe 5)\_\_\_\_\_. 
